Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board Announces Temporary Closing of Fine Wine & Good Spirits Premium Collection Store in Bill Green Shopping Center, Pittsburgh

Pittsburgh – The Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board will temporarily close the Fine Wine & Good Spirits Premium Collection Store in the Bill Green Shopping Center, 10 Old Clairton Rd., Pittsburgh, while the store is remodeled.

The store will close for retail customers at 5:00 PM on Sunday, June 12. The following nearby Fine Wine & Good Spirits stores will remain open to serve consumers in the area:

When it reopens later this year, the remodeled Fine Wine & Good Spirits Premium Collection Store will offer consumers a warmer, more welcoming atmosphere to browse its extensive collection. Upgrades will include a center table featuring a tasting bar, educational information and promotional items, as well as a “Made in Pennsylvania” section to highlight wines and spirits produced in the commonwealth.

The PLCB regulates the distribution of beverage alcohol in Pennsylvania, operates more than 600 wine and spirits stores statewide and licenses more than 20,000 beverage alcohol producers and retailers. The PLCB also works to reduce and prevent dangerous and underage drinking through partnerships with schools, community groups and licensees. Taxes and store profits – totaling more than \$14.5 billion since the agency’s inception – are returned to Pennsylvania’s General Fund, which finances Pennsylvania’s schools, health and human services programs and law enforcement and public safety initiatives across the state, among other things. The PLCB also provides financial support for the Pennsylvania State Police Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement, the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, other state agencies and local municipalities across the state.
