## **Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board to Participate in BrewBQue in Lewisburg, Union County, Pour Wines Exclusive to Event**

**Lewisburg** – The Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (PLCB) is pleased to announce it will participate in the 2016 Lewisburg BrewBQue on Saturday, Aug. 13, from 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM at Hufnagle Park and feature wines exclusively available to taste at this event and purchase in Lewisburg before their statewide launch later this month.

Steve Pollack, buyer for the very popular Chairman's Selection® and Chairman's Advantage® programs, will be on hand along with other Fine Wine & Good Spirits staff to pour wines that pair perfectly with barbecued food. Event attendees will be able to "grill" Steve about his recommendations and learn more about pairing wine with summer eats.

A total of eight wines – poured by Mike Hinshaw, the wine specialist at the Lewisburg store, and wine specialists from other area Fine Wine & Good Spirits stores – will be available for those 21 years of age and older to sample at the BrewBQue, including three Chairman's Selection wines that will be available for purchase at the Fine Wine & Good Spirits Premium Collection Store, Penn House Commons, 310 N. 10th St., Lewisburg, more than a week before they are released statewide.

Last January, the PLCB opened the new Fine Wine & Good Spirits Premium Collection Store in Penn House Commons to meet the growing demand for higher-end wines and spirits in the Lewisburg area. The new store is larger than the one it replaced, and it features about 500 additional products than the old store.

The PLCB regulates the distribution of beverage alcohol in Pennsylvania, operates more than 600 wine and spirits stores statewide and licenses more than 20,000 beverage alcohol producers and retailers. The PLCB also works to reduce and prevent dangerous and underage drinking through partnerships with schools, community groups and licensees. Taxes and store profits – totaling more than \$14.5 billion since the agency's inception – are returned to Pennsylvania's General Fund, which finances Pennsylvania's schools, health and human services programs and law enforcement and public safety initiatives across the state, among other things. The PLCB also provides financial support for the Pennsylvania State Police Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement, the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, other state agencies and local municipalities across the state.
