Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board Announces Temporary Closing of Fine Wine & Good Spirits Store in Hilltown Plaza, Souderton

Souderton – The Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board will temporarily close the Fine Wine & Good Spirits store in Hilltown Plaza, 766 Rte. 113, Souderton, while the store is remodeled.

The store will close for retail customers at 7:00 PM on Sunday, Sept. 4. The following nearby Fine Wine & Good Spirits stores will remain open to serve consumers in the area:

- Hilltown Crossings Shopping Center, 1547 Bethlehem Pike, Hatfield
- Perkasio Square, 511 Constitution Ave., Perkasio
- 4725 County Line Rd., Chalfont
- 2710 Shelly Rd. Harleysville

The Souderton store will continue serving its licensee customers during the renovation process from its warehouse and loading dock area. Store hours for licensee service will be between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM Monday through Friday beginning Tuesday, Sept. 6.

When it reopens, the remodeled Fine Wine & Good Spirits store in Souderton will offer consumers a warmer, more welcoming atmosphere to browse its extensive collection. Upgrades will include a center table featuring educational information and promotional items, as well as a "Made in Pennsylvania" section to highlight wines and spirits produced in the commonwealth.

The PLCB regulates the distribution of beverage alcohol in Pennsylvania, operates more than 600 wine and spirits stores statewide and licenses more than 20,000 beverage alcohol producers and retailers. The PLCB also works to reduce and prevent dangerous and underage drinking through partnerships with schools, community groups and licensees. Taxes and store profits – totaling \$15.1 billion since the agency's inception – are returned to Pennsylvania's General Fund, which finances Pennsylvania's schools, health and human services programs, law enforcement, and public safety initiatives, among other important public services. The PLCB also provides financial support for the Pennsylvania State Police Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement, the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, other state agencies and local municipalities across the state.
